All components of the sanitary sewage collection system are operating properly.

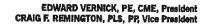

Dear Mr. Orth:

You have asked that I offer an opinion regarding a certain bid that was submitted in response to a Pennsauken Sewerage Authority ("PSA") invitation to bidders and specifications relating to its Annual Sewer System Repairs ("Specs"). Several firms submitted bids and related documents in a timely manner and those bids were opened and tabulated by the PSA's consulting engineer, Remington and Vernick ("R&V"). The bid that you have asked that I evaluate was submitted by Root24hours, Inc. ("Root 24"). The facts that are relevant to the inquiry are as follows.

On the date and time of the bid opening, a representative of Root 24, Chris Kuensel ("Kuensel") made it known that there was a potential problem with its bid in that it did not include an original Bid Bond and Consent of Surety as required by the Specs. He explained that a delay in FedEx delivery was the cause of the problem and that a Bank Check in lieu of Bid Bond in the amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) was included with the companies bid documents.

Upon opening Root 24's package, the representative of R&V who was supervising the bid opening, discovered a form of Bid Bond and Consent of Surety. When asked about these documents Kuensel confirmed that they were not originals from his bonding company but were forms he had "in his office". The day after the bid opening, Root 24 advised R&V that the original Bid Bond and Consent of Surety had arrived at the firm's office and offered to deliver them to R&V.

From these facts it is readily apparent that there was no Bid Bond and no Consent of Surety submitted with the bid of Root 24. Root 24 acknowledged this omission and acted as though this was the case by including a Bank Check in lieu of Bid Bond with its package. Parenthetically, the Bank Check would have been sufficient bid security in lieu of bond. The significant omission is the Consent of Surety.

The requirement for Consent of Surety is set forth in *NJSA 40A: 11-22*. It is a required certificate from an acceptable surety that assures the public entity engaged in a bid procurement, that should the bidder in question be awarded a contract, the surety will in fact issue its performance bond to cover the contract work. In the case of *Meadowbrook Carting Co., Inc. v Borough of Island Heights*, 138 *NJ* 307 (1994), our Supreme Court made it clear that failure to include a required consent of surety is a material defect that can be neither waived nor cured. (*Id.* at 320) Since *Meadowbrook*, the Local Public Contracts Law has been amended to specifically provide that a consent of surety is a material, non-curable and non-waivable part of any bid. (See *NJSA 40A: 11-23.2*)

Unfortunately for the bidder, the effort to supply the original consent of surety a day after the bid opening cannot cure the omission. Hence, the bid of Root24hours, Inc. in this case must be rejected as nonconforming in my opinion.
